Frequently Asked Questions

How do I apply to the Academic Support Center?

To be accepted into the Academic Support Center, you must first meet the admission requirements of Notre Dame College and be accepted into Notre Dame College. You must also meet with the Director of the Academic Support Center and submit documentation of a specific learning disability, ADHD or dyslexia.

Do students in the Academic Support Center take the same classes as the other NDC students?

Yes, the students with the ASC take the same classes and must meet the same expectations as the other Notre Dame students. Students who participate in the Academic Support Center may major or minor in any of the programs offered at Notre Dame College.

What type of support is offered at the Academic Support Center for Students with Learning Differences?

All of the students with the ASC participate in an orientation program so that they are relaxed and ready to begin college. Furthermore, the students with the ASC have individual tutoring in their courses of an hour per week per subject and also receive individual tutoring on organizational skills. The ASC offers its students' workshops on reading comprehension, time management skills, test taking strategies, and the use of adaptive equipment. Additionally, the ASC students have monthly Support Group Meetings, a quarterly newsletter, and unlimited use of and training in adaptive equipment. Mid-term reports are sent out for every class taken by the students. The year ends with an Awards Ceremony for the Academic Support Center students.
