



PSYCHOLOGY ADJUNCTS

Fall, 2017 Psychology Adjunct Opportunities

The Psychology Department is seeking adjuncts to teach the following courses:

PY 222 Behavioral Science Statistics 3 cr.

Mondays and Wednesdays 12:00pm – 1:15pm

This course provides instruction in the application of descriptive and inferential statistics to the analysis and interpretation of data in the social sciences with an emphasis on hypothesis testing. Students develop skills in the communication of statistical information. Students learn theory and application of statistical hypothesis testing, to test for significance of relationships between variables, and differences between groups in a variety of situations. Students learn to clearly and accurately communicate findings and accurately interpret the presentation of statistical findings encountered in research. Prerequisites: PY 201, MA 110; MA 221 strongly recommended. (Student learning outcomes 1, 2).

PY 498 Psychology Senior Seminar 3 cr.

Mondays and Wednesdays 2:15pm – 3:30pm

This course focuses on the integration of psychological methods and theories. Psychology majors, with faculty assistance, choose a major issue in psychology to investigate and discuss in seminar-style course sessions. This work culminates in a major course presentation and theoretical paper written in APA style. Prerequisite: Senior standing or instructor permission. (Student learning outcomes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5).
